Dear Friends and Family of First Presbyterian:

<u>Know God</u>

Well, as it happens every year, the holiday season is behind us and the New Year beckons. And like many of you, I'm thinking of how I might rid myself of some of the extra holiday poundage that I've accumulated around my mid-section. Oh the freedom that holidays bring to eat and drink with wild abandon! But now... the scale shows the consequences! How can I re-engage in the disciplines of temperance and perseverance, both to limit what I eat and drink as well as to exercise consistently? It seems an annual tradition...

But as your pastor, I always have other things on my mind. The physical challenges that most of us share are always combined with spiritual challenges that should concern all of us. How will we re-engage with spiritual disciplines that will help us to grow in our faith and freedom in Jesus Christ?

And in this New Year, I wonder how our church might become stronger in our acts of service, both to one another and in our community.

In his book, *A Long Obedience in the Same Direction*, Eugene Peterson writes about the Psalms of Ascent (120-134). Each Psalm of Ascent – the songs that pilgrims would sing on their way up to Jerusalem – becomes an opportunity for us to practice "discipleship in an instant society."¹ Chapter 5 studies Psalm 123, a song that teaches us about service:

To you I lift up my eyes, O you who are enthroned in the heavens! Behold, as the eyes of servants look to the hand of their master, as the eyes of a maidservant to the hand of her mistress, so our eyes look to the LORD our God, till he has mercy upon us. Have mercy upon us, O LORD, have mercy upon us, for we have had more than enough of contempt. Our soul has had more than enough of the scorn of those who are at ease, of the contempt of the proud.

Peterson emphasizes the position of the servant, looking up to God, "The servant assumes a certain posture, a stance. If he or she fails to take that posture, attentive responsiveness to the master's commands will be hard."² As we are called to be servants of God, we must remember to look to God as the One who both provides all we need while giving us the commands that we must endeavor to complete.

While Jesus came from heaven to earth to serve his people:

God is not a servant to be called into action when we are too tired to do something ourselves, not an expert to be called on when we find we are ill equipped to handle a specialized problem in living.... God is not a buddy we occasionally ask to join us at our convenience or for our diversion. God did not become a servant so that we could order him around but so that we could join him in a redemptive life.³

Peterson continues. "Too often we think of religion as a far-off, mysteriously run bureaucracy to which we apply for assistance when we feel the need. We go to a local branch office and direct the clerk (sometimes called a pastor) to fill out our order for God. Then we go home and wait for God to be delivered to us according to the specifications that we have set down."⁴

When we are first looking to have our own needs met, rather than looking to serve one another through faith, we pervert the love and service of Christ. All too often we think that others exist to serve us, to meet our needs. And when we treat others as our servants, when we break the bonds of service to others, when we think we are above serving others first, Peterson argues that we actually lose out on the freedom that Jesus desires for us. "Freedom is on everyone's lips. Freedom is announced and celebrated. But not many feel or act free. Evidence? We live in a nation of complainers and a society of addicts."⁵ Prioritizing our desires, we become slaves to our own sins.

But the Psalm sings of a different way.

"Have mercy upon us, O LORD, have mercy upon us!"

And as we ask God for mercy, we must extend mercy to others. And how better to show mercy than to serve? If God chooses to serve us, should we not then learn better how to serve others?

Peterson writes, "The Christian is a person who recognizes that our real problem is not in achieving freedom but in learning service under a better master. The Christian realizes that every relationship that excludes God becomes oppressive. Recognizing and realizing that, we urgently want to live under the mastery of God."⁶

Our church is learning this lesson.

I am so pleased that so many of you are involved in our ministry of service to the poor and to the homeless of our community. Let me be the first to say that this ministry is not easy nor is it simple. But in the complexities of learning to love the least of these, we will always be confronted with the complications of loving those who are often, by the world's standards, unlovable. Many questions and challenges remain: Why do we serve those who choose not to work? How can we address mental illnesses? How do we protect the vulnerable while confronting patterns of violence and addiction? I don't know the answers to these questions, but in our service to others, we are growing in our understanding of how God loves and serves us.

And at the same time, we must learn to better serve each other. And we serve each other best when we worship well together. As Peterson writes, "The word *latreia* means 'service,' the work one does on behalf of the community. But it also is the base of our word *liturgy*, the service of worship that we render to God. And it is precisely that service that is logical, reasonable. The service we offer to God (in worship) is extended into specific acts that serve others."


When we worship well together, we learn how to serve one another. And when we serve one another, we will worship well together.

As this new year begins, let us learn that freedom does not consist in doing whatever it is we want whenever we want to do it. As my waistline can attest, there are consequences when one doesn't respect limits. True freedom, however, exists when we learn to serve God and serve others.

Let 2023 be a year of freedom.
